Tomahawk baseball team takes 3rd at **Senior Salute**

ST. PAUL - This past spring, high school athletes in every sport were unable to compete because of the COVID-19 pandemic, and it was hard especially for the seniors who didn't get to compete in one last season without warning.

However, the St. Paul Saints teamed up with high schools all over the state to let senior baseball players compete in the Senior Salute games at CHS Field and Northwestern Field in St. Paul. Sixteen area players from the Tomahawk Conference competed and took third place overall on Sunday at CHS Field, going a combined 5-1 at the tournament that lasted over two weeks.

The team was coached by St. Mary's coach Bruce Woitas, Sleepy Eye coach Aaron Nesvold, Cathedral coach Alan Woitas, and MVL assistant coach John Giefer.

The Tomahawk team opened the tournament on July 21 with a 4-3 victory over Team Minnesota (Team Tomahawk rallied from a 3-1 deficit in the bottom of the seventh inning) and a 7-0 win over the Gopher Conference team. On July 27, they beat the Southeast Conference team 10-4 to qualify for the final round of 8, which started on July 31.
