Riverbend met and is looking at blacktopping their parking lot and leasing a new building, also health insurance is an ongoing issue.

Principal: MCA testing also starting in HS beginning next Monday. Teacher training this Thursday morning before school. Grade level incentives communicated to promote student effort. Will also be completing paraprofessional evaluation meetings. Statewide severe weather awareness drill Thursday at 1:45. Placing electives in the master schedule for next year. Gold Cord on Wednesday, April 17th at 6:00. Time adjusted due to including a meal this year. Student recognition breakfast moved to April 26th. This will start at 7:15 AM

Superintendent: MSBA Day at the Capitol: Darla and I attended the event on March 18 th . Several senate and house leadership attended the meeting and had a round table forum and also took questions from the audience. We also visited with Senator Dahms and Rep. Torkelson and shared our legislative priorities with them. Legislative update: With a shortened week due to the first of three legislative recesses, the Legislature held fewer committee hearings and fewer bills heard. And, as we inch closer to the April 19 budget bill deadline, we are now at the tail end of weeks of hearings. 1. Changes to the Read Act including extending the professional development timeline for reading intervention teachers, literacy specialists, etc. to July 1, 2026. 2. Extending the effective date for the prohibition on American Indian mascots from September 1, 2025, to September 1, 2026. Monday, May 20 6 th grade CRIC Integration event at SC College: Our 6 th graders will join with the Redwood Area and Springfield 6 th grade classes and will have the opportunity to explore South Central College on April 12 th . The Calendar Committee met and reviewed the proposed 2024-25 calendar and is recommending it for approval. We have been working on the building project survey and have our first draft ready. Surveys

will be going out probably in the middle of June. Elementary: MCA para and staff test trainings completed by today; MCA testing start next week, 3-6 grade levels set multi-tier MCA goals to achieve; 6th grade CRIC career and college exploration event is on Friday 4/12; 3rd teacher goal setting meetings are on their way; annual paraprofessional evaluation meetings are starting; Site visit from MDE on April 24th 8:00-10:00 looking at our computer tech/coding implementation.
